HEY SENIOR FAMILIES! Please see the information below from our KISD Fine Arts Team:

Please take note of the date for our upcoming Fine Arts Signing Day: Wednesday, April 30th! Fine Arts Signing Day is designed to celebrate ANY high school graduate who will pursue the fine arts beyond high school. Students can be accepted into Junior College or University and pursue a two-year associate's degree or a four-year bachelor's degree.

They will submit information to me (Denise Banks) using a Google Form that is linked <u>here</u>. All participants must submit their

information via this Google Form to avoid any last-minute issues, such as students walking in for participation without our prior knowledge, inaccurate counts of attendees, no table for a student, etc. (It happens \bigcirc) So please be sure to stress the importance of your students signing up with the Fine Arts office through the Google Form by Friday, April 25th.

Lastly, here are some other details:

1. Students will be provided with a rectangular banquet table (No linens are provided) that they can decorate representing their future alma mater and their high school accomplishments. I have a couple of examples below:


